1. System Requirements


- **Eclipse 4.5.x** (**Windows 32-bit**) (RCP and RAP Developers version is recommended) https://eclipse.org/downloads/index-developer.php
- **Java Runtime Environment (JRE) 7.0 or above** (Version 8 is recommended) https://java.com/ja/download/
- Internet Explorer 11.0 or above

Note: Please use 32-bit version of Eclipse and JRE whether your OS is 64-bit or 32-bit.

2 Installation of ACTF Visualization SDK

You can install ACTF Visualization SDK by using Eclipse Update mechanism.

Step 1: Select **Help -> Install New Software** menu.



Step 2: Type ACTF update-site URL (http://download.eclipse.org/technology/actf/1.1/update-site) into "Work with:" input box.

Step 3: Select ACTF Visualization SDK, and press **Next** button. Then, please follow instruction of the update wizard.

ACTF Visualization SDK includes developer guide (API references, etc.). Please open Eclipse Help from 'Help' -> 'Help Contents' menu and select 'Eclipse Visualization SDK Developer Guide'.

3. Download HTML Checker source code

1. Download zipped Team Project Set file for HTML Checker.

2. Unzip the downloaded file and import Team Project Set file (htmlchecker.psf) from Eclipse's 'File' -> 'Import' -> 'Team' -> 'Team Project Set' menu.

4. Launch HTML Checker

Select and open "org.eclipse.actf.examples.htmlchecker" project.

Then, select (double click) htmlchecker.product file and open it in a product editor. In the editor, select 'Launch an Eclipse Application' under 'Testing' section.



In this case, ACTF HTML Checker assumes that a target HTML file list (htmllist.txt) is placed in Eclipse's folder (e.g., "c:\text{\text{\$\text{\$4}}}eclipse\text{\text{\$\text{\$4}}}htmllist.txt").

A sample "htmllist.txt" file is in "org.eclipse.actf.examples.htmlchecker-feature" project's "rootfiles" folder. So, please copy it into your Eclipse's folder and edit it.

You can also specify a file path of your target HTML file list. Select "Run" -> "Run Configurations" menu of Eclipse, and specify an option below into "Program arguments" area of "Arguments" tab.

-f "c:\test\htmllist.txt"


In above case, HTML Checker will read target HTML file list from "c:\text{*test\text{*htmllist.txt}".}

The results of HTML check will be placed into "result" folder in Eclipse's folder. Error messages will be written into "log.txt" in Eclipse's folder.

5. Build HTML Checker

Select and open "org.eclipse.actf.examples.htmlchecker" project as in step 4.

Open an export product wizard by selecting 'Eclipse product export wizard' under 'Exporting' section and follow the wizard.



Please turn off all options in "Export Options" section, and please select "Finish" button.

Then, htmlchecker.exe will be generated into the folder specified at "Directory" option. A sample htmllist.txt will be placed into the same folder with htmlchecker.exe. Please modify it and launch htmlchecker.exe to check target html files. After that, results will be placed into "result" folder.

You can also specify a file path of your target HTML file list from command line, as below.

htmlchecker.exe -f "../../htmllist2.txt"
